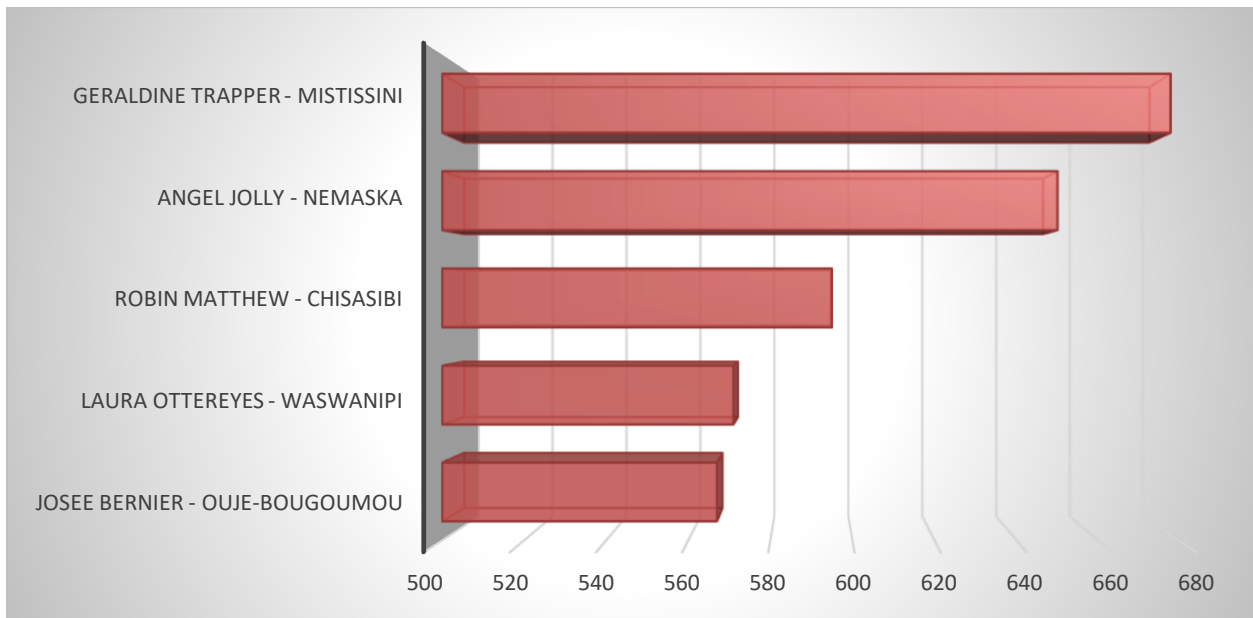

**PUBLIC STATEMENT**  
**MISS EYYOU EENOU ISKWAAU OFFICIAL RESULTS**

**Chisasibi, QC** --- The Cree Women of Eeyou Association (CWEIA)'s public statement of the official results of the Miss Eeyou Eenou Iskwaau (MEEI).

After a thorough review and verification of the results by our team and by a third-party verification company, GNITIC Inc., we discovered that there was an error in one of the formulas that were used to calculate the results. Therefore, there has been a change to the 2<sup>nd</sup> runner-up title. This is the official results.



According to the official results, we officially declare **Miss Chisasibi - Robin Matthew as 2<sup>nd</sup> Runner up.** The results for the Miss Eeyou Eenou Iskwaau Miss Mistissini Geraldine Trapper and 1<sup>st</sup> runner-up Miss Nemaska Angel Jolly did not change. They remain as is, therefore the official declarations are as follows.
